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### Message from Trustbuilding Program (TBP) Indonesia Manager

2023 is our third year of operating the Trustbuilding Program (TBP) under the mentorship and support from lofC International. This year we developed a more solid program and tools as well as the need to raise funds and collaborate more as we did not received any funding from lofC international.

We are grateful for all the achievements and victories in 2023; we launched and held the Dialogue for Change program in Jakarta and Bandung four times as well as hosted Interfaith and Intercultural Dialogue for healing in UIN Jakarta twice. We facilitated the interfaith dialogue between Christian students from University of the Nations and Muslim students from State Islamic University Jakarta twice this year. In Bandung we worked closely with interfaith community leaders for mediation workshops and engaged with Christian students and churches as well as with the Pesantren Community.

This year we also received an invitation to lead trustbuilding trainings for corporate start ups in Bandung.

TBP enabled young people and interfaith community leaders to be in a safe space for interaction to share ideas in a respectful manner in the light of Intercultural and Interreligious Dialogue to heal historical wounds.

## About Trustbuilding Program

Indonesia faces increased intolerance and divides among people of different religions and ethnicities and the threat of violent extremism. The Trustbuilding work in Indonesia aims to inspire mutual trust and understanding to increase social cohesion and avoid radicalisation.







# Why is trust needed?

Indonesia has been struggling with religious extremism for decades. An extreme form of intolerance has been seen in recent terrorist attacks where sympathisers of ISIS have carried out incidents. Around 700 Indonesians have joined ISIS in Syria, some of whom have returned to Indonesia.

Despite these threats, Indonesian democracy has made impressive progress, which must be maintained toward its national election in 2024. This makes it a strategically relevant moment to put extra energy into working with young people and counter the trend of increased intolerance and extremism.

### How is trust built?

#### Mobilising young leaders

The project brings together youth interfaith communities. Through workshops and trustbuilding camps, young people get inspired to overcome their differences which empowers them to advocate for positive change.

#### Developing tools for trustbuilding

Custom-designed tools, such as board games, are developed to integrate trustbuilding principles in playful ways to build trustful connections.

### Problem Statement & Theory of Change:

There is a lack of safe space/place for youth to engage with diverse ideas in a respectful manner to heal historical wounds.

> If a safe space for intercultural and interreligious dialogue, inner peace and healing historical wounds are facilitated individually as well as community using a creative media and reflective method. Then young people from different backgrounds of religion and culture will be inspired, equipped and connected and work towards peace and social cohesion.

## Most Significance Story of Change

### Training of Facilitator, Trustbuilding Program

"The changes I've experienced are:

- I've come to know myself better, realizing that before understanding others, we must first understand ourselves as facilitators.

- It turns out that wounds can lead to growth when I'm willing to undergo the healing process. Someone can impact and become a blessing through the wounds they've endured.



- I've acquired skills related to the life diagram, analyzing historical wounds, asking reflective questions without expecting immediate answers, and then finding those answers within myself. It involves recognizing scars, removing masks, evolving into a new person, and becoming whole.

- Personally, I've grown to understand that people's actions are often rooted in their past experiences. I'm trying to understand myself and others more, refrain from jumping to conclusions, and be open to deeper understanding. For instance. listening fellow to a community member's story of their past wounds as a special needs child. So far, I've had limited interaction with all members of the community and have understood fully my fellow not community members. Moving forward, I aim to enhance communication and engage in more sharing within the community."

"Through this program, I gained a completely new experience that I've never had before. Usually, I'd only acquire theoretical knowledge without putting it into practice. But this time was different—' One stroke of the oar, two, three islands surpassed.' I could put it into practice right away, even alongside native speakers from America. Starting from building trust, and actively listening to someone's story, to enjoying sharing my narratives with others.

I gained a plethora of new insights and found the concept of 'quiet time' incredibly intriguing. I also made new friends with whom I could exchange a wealth of information and knowledge from different Understanding perspectives. the intricacies of American culture directly from Americans, learning about Korean cultures, and hearing firsthand stories about both South and North Korea. Understanding the concepts of forgiveness, love, and relationship with God in an applicable way, and listening directly to the experiences of non-Islamic students regarding these concepts." -

In my view, when we communicate and exchange ideas, we can learn a lot about different beliefs and values. This, in turn, helps us build stronger relationships.

This brings significant benefits in creating a more inclusive and friendly environment for everyone. By respecting and appreciating our differences, we can learn from one another, creating stronger relationships that contribute to peace and harmony in a diverse society.
