Through the School of Reconciliation, we have witnessed young people, parents, educators, community leaders, and grassroots movements rediscover the power of listening, empathy, integrity, and courageous conversations. Many participants come with wounds, distrust, family conflicts, and prejudice — but leave with renewed hope, deeper understanding, and commitment to become bridge-builders in their homes and communities.

One of the strongest foundations of peace is the family. We believe reconciliation must begin at home — through healthy communication, emotional healing, mutual respect, and the restoration of trust between parents, children, and communities. In today's world, many families face pressures from economic challenges, social polarization, digital disconnection, and mental health struggles.

Therefore, strengthening family resilience is essential to building a peaceful and compassionate society.

The impact of the School of Reconciliation has reached beyond classrooms. Alumni have initiated family dialogue circles, youth mentoring programs, interfaith collaborations, community healing spaces, and educational movements that nurture resilience, empathy, and social responsibility.

Indonesia does not only need intelligent people; Indonesia needs people with character, compassion, emotional resilience, and moral courage. This is the heart of the School of Reconciliation.

We believe sustainable peace begins from inner transformation, grows through family reconciliation, and creates wider social transformation.

As Executive Director of IofC Indonesia, I invite more individuals, institutions, and communities to become part of this journey — to build an Indonesia that is more humane, resilient, united, and rooted in trust across differences.

Message from Sekolah Rekonsiliasi Coordinator



At the age of 27, I began to realize that it is not only myself who needs space to heal and grow, but there are so many people out there who are also struggling and fighting for a better life. Some feel hopeless and think about ending their lives, not because they want to die, but because they do not know how to face and navigate life in the right way.

I feel deeply privileged to have found IofC, which has given me a path toward healing and growth.

Through IofC, I had the opportunity to meet Nandor Lim and AKASHA, and to learn more deeply about life. I began practicing the values of IofC and the discipline of Quiet Time, engaging in inner listening, answering life questions one by one, and slowly discovering new meanings about life.

Through the classes I attended, the books I read, and the exercises I practiced, I gradually started to understand why challenges, conflicts, pain, and difficulties exist in life. They are not simply there to frustrate us. If we are willing to understand them, they are the very things that help us grow and become mature human beings.

This deeper understanding of life also helps us see how the universe works through the systems created by God. Our suffering often comes simply because we have not yet understood the lessons and wisdom behind our experiences.

My personal healing has been a gradual process, one that requires patience, but every small change along the way is incredibly meaningful and that is why I am committed to continuing this work, serving those who are willing to change and grow through the School of Reconciliation, and inviting more people to join this journey.

Our mission is to reach 1 percent of Indonesia's population out of 288 million people. So far, around 500 individuals have been impacted by the School of Reconciliation. Our journey is still long, and the road ahead will not be easy. But nothing is impossible. Even though this will be a long and challenging journey, my team and I are committed to continuing this work.

What is SR?

Sekolah Rekonsiliasi (School of Reconciliation – SR) is one of the programs under the Initiative of Change Indonesia Foundation (IofC Indonesia). This program is a learning platform for adults to improve literacy and find their true selves through the process of reading books and reflecting on them. The learning process is facilitated through a safe and supportive environment.

This school encourages each participant to grow through a curriculum designed based on community, which means that learning is done in groups with mutual support. In addition, SR also accompanies each participant to reconcile with the people around them, both in the past and in the present, and find healing along with the learning process.

Online Talk: Action for Peace: Storytelling as Part of Healing Journey

March 2025

This online talk was held in March 2025 as a collaboration between the Sekolah Rekonsiliasi team and our long-time friend, Rhonda from Canada. The event was conducted online and aimed to introduce what Sekolah Rekonsiliasi is and the work we do.

The session, titled “Storytelling as Part of the Healing Journey,” strengthened our ongoing work and was very well received by our friend Rhonda as well as by all participants who attended the event. We hope that similar activities can be held more frequently in the future and shared with friends around the world within the IofC International network.



The 2nd Learning Community International Life-Work Conference May-June 2025

As a Co-Organizer, it was a remarkable experience for us. Our team, Sekolah Rekonsiliasi (SR), was heavily involved in the conference, from attending regular planning meetings to being part of the core organizing committee, including the Design and Participant teams.

In this conference, the team shared our good practices. Hayati led the Quiet Time for Inner Listening session on the first day, Nenden and Meir shared on the Plenary session. Hayati, Nenden, Meir and Pipit shared their story in the Living Library Book sharing. The conference features a diverse range of activities, including Quiet Time for Inner Listening, Plenary sessions, Living Library sharing, Open Space Technology, and creative performances. Participants thoroughly enjoyed the blend of inner-growth and outer-exploration with others.

The conference's take away to be followed up is a new collaboration between IofC Philippines and Sekolah Rekonsiliasi as the Philippine team plans to open a class similar to SR. As well as an initiative to expand the space especially for men in MENTALK (in the local context) to "Men Awakening" forum globally with AKASHA and the South African team.



In-Person Class at Bolaang Mongondow, North Sulawesi

June-July 2025

This Outreach activity was the very first outreach conducted by Sekolah Rekonsiliasi, and it took place at a considerable distance, in Eastern Indonesia—specifically in Bolaang Mongondow, North Sulawesi. The outreach was held from June 22 to July 8, 2025. Its purpose was to conduct in-person classes: two On the Family classes and one Homecoming class. The two facilitators who traveled for this outreach were Rinni Meir and Nenden Prawira. The participants were teachers in one school of a Seventh-day Adventist Christian community, called Madison school.

The key findings from these classes showed that each participant engaged in inner work—addressing issues from childhood, school years, and adolescence—and was able to identify the root causes of certain difficulties they experienced in adulthood. These recognized issues became valuable foundations for deeper self-awareness, both in family relationships and in managing their classrooms.

“The most significant change has been in the way I communicate. I’ve begun to learn how to pause, recognize the emotions that arise, and then express them more honestly and responsibly. Emotions no longer erupt or get suppressed; instead, they are processed.

This has made my relationships with my partner and my parents healthier, more open, and more mutually understanding.”

“The learning process in this class led me to an important realization: I can no longer continue living with old patterns shaped by childhood wounds.

For the first time, I truly stopped and looked at those wounds honestly. I began to understand that suppressing them never leads to healing; it only makes the wounds deeper and harder to reach.

I learned that caring for these wounds requires the courage to acknowledge them—the courage to say, ‘I am hurt,’ without feeling guilty or afraid of being judged.”

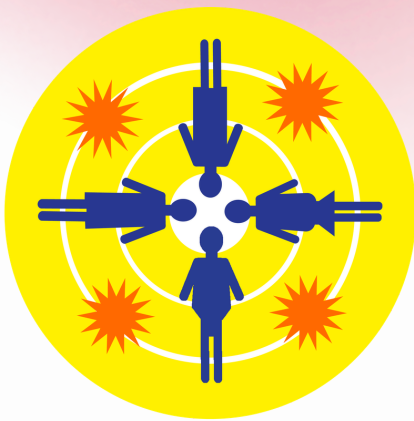
